BROWARD MPO ATTENDS CONFERENCE TO BOOST GOOD GROWTH IN BROWARD COUNTY



Members of the public were encouraged to ask questions from the panel.

On Wednesday, February 18th, Broward County elected officials, economic development and government planning professionals, private developers, business leaders and local residents took part in a senior level conference that focused on redevelopment on US 441/State Road (SR) 7.

Presented by the Broward Alliance, the half-day conference coined "Redevelopment in Broward County – Rethinking Redevelopment in a Changing Market," took place on the campus of Nova Southeastern University in Davie. The event featured experts sharing insight on managing the challenges and opportunities of redevelopment, and focused on the history and long term plans for the US 441/State Road (SR) 7 Corridor.

US 441/SR-7 in Broward County is a culturally rich and ethnically diverse corridor with many pockets of economically depressed areas in different stages of redevelopment. The corridor presents the heaviest transit use in the county. At this time, the buses are not enough to handle the number of riders as demand continues to increase.

The proposed solution is a short term transit enhancement plan to address the immediate needs of a transit dependent population complemented with a medium to long range component to implement a Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) corridor. This corridor will be the spine of a future high capacity transit network in the county.

The transit project will benefit a growing ethnically and socially diverse population along the corridor by providing access to major economic activity centers as well as major regional air, rail, roadway, and port connections. The project area is being master-planned for mixed-use, transit-oriented development to strengthen the economic vitality of the region and in support of the project.

2007 Sistrunk Historical Festival



Of those surveyed, almost 37% indicated that their major transportation concern was regarding mass transit, while 36% stated traffic congestion. Other issues of concern included safety and funding.

The 19th Annual Hispanic Fest

Pembroke Pines community residents, as well as event-goers from the tri-county area, came to the Pembroke Pines Community Center on Saturday, March 17th to celebrate Hispanic Fest 2007.

In its 19th year, this annual festival, organized by Hispanic Unity of Florida, celebrates Hispanic culture and traditions and is Broward County's longestrunning Hispanic Festival.

This year's festivities featured the Broward MPO informational display and transportation planning professionals that surveyed and spoke to event-goers about the local and regional transportation planning process.

There were also delicious Latin foods, Salsa dance lessons, arts & crafts, children's entertainment, and live Latin music on two stages, including performances by El Gran Combo, Jorge Celedon, and Tobby Love.

The Broward MPO event team surveyed 98 attendees during the event. Of those surveyed, almost 50% stated their major transportation concern was traffic congestion. Other issues of concern included the county's need for better mass transit systems and lower bus fares.
