The Community Involvement Roundtable (CIR) is an advisory committee of the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (Broward MPO) that meets monthly, and is comprised of members of the public from various cities, towns and community organizations, that provide insight into local communities. The CIR acts as a voice for public opinion relating to general transportation issues, ultimately helping to form Broward's urban landscape.

During their October 2008 meeting, the CIR determined that at least one meeting per quarter would be devoted to transit related issues, and no other items would be placed on the agenda for discussion. As a result, the first transitfocused roundtable meeting was organized, and took place on November 5, 2008.

The Broward MPO will fund 300 new bus shelters. A series of community meetings will be planned for the residents of Broward County to get input from the general public with regard to transit-related

A reduction of 4.3 million dollars in operating budget has forced BCT to scale back service and make cuts in fixed bus routes and community buses.

One of BCT's most valuable programs is their Paratransit, also known as Transportation Options (TOPS). BCT's TOPS received the prestigious 2008 Urban Community Transportation Coordinator of the Year award from the State of Florida by the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged (CTD). This award, presented at the 16th Annual Transportation Disadvantaged Training and Technology Conference, held on August 27, 2008 in Orlando, highlighted BCT's commitment to providing paratransit services in the most efficient and cost-effective method for more than 16,000 customers in Broward County.

Having previously won this award in 1999 and 2003, BCT was extremely pleased because they had completely re-structured the paratransit business model in 2007. The award was a great team effort and the Broward MPO shares in this success!

The CTD contracts with the Broward MPO to serve as the official planning agency for Broward County. The Broward MPO employs an associate planner, Ms. Deborah Byrnes, who oversees the Transit Disadvantaged (TD) Program for the Broward MPO. She prepares agenda items and presentations to the Broward MPO, and also serves as their program manager for the grant. She also serves as staff to the Broward County Coordinating Board for Transportation Disadvantaged Services (BCCB); serving as liaison between the BCCB and the CTD, the Broward MPO and Broward County Transportation Department.
