

#### **BROWARD MPO FOCUSES ON BIKE SAFETY**

Every year in the United States, bicycle-related deaths number about 900 and emergency rooms treat almost 500,000 people for bicyclerelated injuries. Florida has the nation's highest annual number of bicycle fatalities.

In an effort to encourage everyone to model safe behaviors and enhance the safety of all road users, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), has developed a public education campaign regarding the 3-Foot Law. The campaign educates motorists about Florida Statute 316.083: Overtaking and Passing, the law states a motorist must pass a bicyclist by no less than 3 feet.

The MPO's three pronged campaign targets the general public and the motorist. For the general public, the MPO created a high visibility display

that will be placed at the Sawgrass Mills Mall from September 17th to October 16th. After October 16th the display will then be stationed throughout Broward County at libraries, police stations and othervenuestocreate



further public awareness. Along with displays are complementary handouts

> and posters. To better inform the motorist about the law, for one month, there will be posters on twenty-eightBroward County Transit buses. To educate the new motorist, for three months, there will be a short video

At the September 20th Broward MPO meeting the Board approved the consultant contract that will start the process of updating the current 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan to the 2040 planning horizon. The LRTP sets the framework for the future and provides investment in new premium transit service, major roadway improvements, new interchanges, bicycle paths, new transit lines, pedestrian paths, new bridges, and much more. Message From The Chair

I hope all of you had a great summer and you are ready for the busy upcoming season. It's hard to believe that we are already wrapping up the 2011/2012 fiscal year for the Broward MPO. The MPO has made great progress and I would like to take the opportunity in this message to speak about that. For the 2011/12 fiscal year, the MPO had \$737,255,662 total dollars programmed for various projects and initiatives. Out of the total dollars programmed, they are for the following categories:

✓ Roadways✓ Transit

√ Rail √ Ports

**✓** Aviation

✓ Transportation Disadvantaged

The roadway category includes projects and programs related not only to roadways, but bikeways, pedestrian/sidewalks, safety and enhancement projects. This is the Complete Streets concept, which looks at projects holistically. Below is a summary of the funding that was programmed for each category in 2011/2012 and for the upcoming 2012/2013 fiscal year. These figures represent actual funds available to be spent on engineering and construction. One important project of note added to this year's budget in the amount of \$30,942,707 is The Wave Streetcar in Downtown Fort Lauderdale www.wavestreetcar.com.

#### **EDUCATION AND OUTREACH**

On July 13th Greg Stuart, Executive Director, spoke at the Gold Coast ITE Conference held at the Miami-Dade Expressway Authority. This workshop focused on the impact of the Panama Canal expansion on South Florida's transportation infrastructure and travel modes.

On July 17th Chris Ryan, Public Information Officer and Title VI Coordinator participated and led a discussion in a Public Engagement Open House as part of the U.S. Department of Transportation's (USDOT) Environmental Justice Training for Transportation

Practitioners. The Open House took place at USDOT's Headquarters in Washington D.C.



Broward MPO is one of the multiple partners in the Broward Boulevard Gateway Implementation Project and MPO staff participated in a Public Design Workshop (pictured above) that was hosted by the City of Fort Lauderdale on August 4th.

MPO Transportation Planner Priscila Clawges, is now a LEED Green Associate. She recently passed the required exam to accomplish this accreditation. The exam is designed to measure your ability to understand and support green design, construction, and operations. LEED is Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design, which is an internationally recognized mark of excellence in green building technology developed by the U.S. Green Building Council.

#### **HOLLYWOOD/PINES CORRIDOR PROJECT IS UNDERWAY**



The Broward MPO is focusing its planning process to provide a livable community that is safe, enjoyable, and sustainable for all citizens and visitors, whether you walk, bike, ride, or drive. The majority of people use a car to travel from one place to another. For others, walking, bicycling, or using transit would be the preferable choice, but those options may be neither safe nor convenient. More importantly, for some people, such as seniors, children, or those without cars, transportation choices are limited, and traveling from one place to another can be a challenge.

The Hollywood/Pines Corridor Project is the MPO's first project that combines traditional Congestion Management and Livability Planning to improve safety and mobility along this corridor. The MPO, with its partner agencies

and municipalities, will work with individuals, community groups, businesses, governmental agencies, and other stakeholders throughout the Study Area. The Project is an initial step in implementing Mobility Hubs, which are points of connection for different types of transportation in Broward County. This effort will also include studies of land use and livability, including the location of multimodal (bicycle, pedestrian, and transit) infrastructure, street connectivity, land use designations, and redevelopment guidelines. The resulting implementation strategies will encourage investment that creates a transit-ready habitat, and allows the Cities of Pembroke Pines and Hollywood to grow sustainably over time. Specific outcomes of this project will be:

- Implement strategies other than road widening to reduce congestion while increasing safety for all transportation modes
- Develop complementary congestion management solutions and land use strategies
- Implement projects and policies that promote the development of Mobility Hubs
- Improve transit operations and a transit supportive land use through short and long-term strategies
