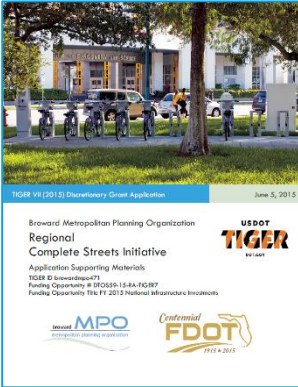

Preliminary results of an analysis conducted on two potential local option tax options: Charter County and Regional Transportation System Surtax (Transportation Surtax) and Local Government Infrastructure Surtax (Infrastructure Surtax) were presented to the Board at the September meeting. The analysis distributed potential funds (approximately 11 trillion) based on requirements documented within the *2014 Local Government Financial Information Handbook* and Florida Statutes. Only the Transportation Surtax allows for use of funds towards the operation and maintenance of transit, while the Infrastructure Surtax specific requires 60% of the funds be distributed to municipalities.

TIGER FY2015 Grant Application



A Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) Grant was submitted in June 2015 requesting Federal funding to construct bicycle and pedestrian facilities. These projects will provide transportation connections and promote safety throughout Broward. Further, these projects will build upon the MPO's Complete Streets Initiative which represents a commitment of \$100 million over the next five years to construct an additional 90 miles of bicycle facilities and approximately 35 miles of sidewalks along Broward's existing roadways. TIGER grant awards were announced on October 29, 2015. Unfortunately, no TIGER grants were awarded to Florida. MPO staff will continue to pursue funding options.
