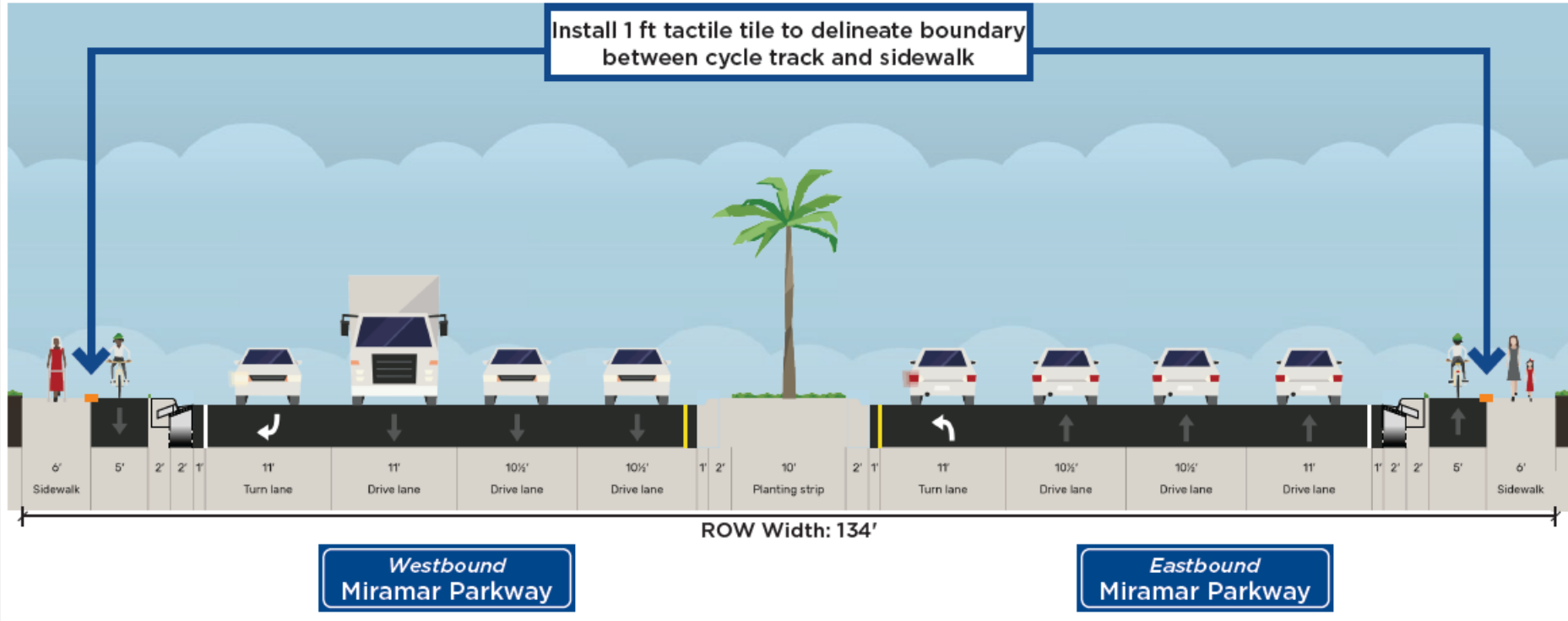

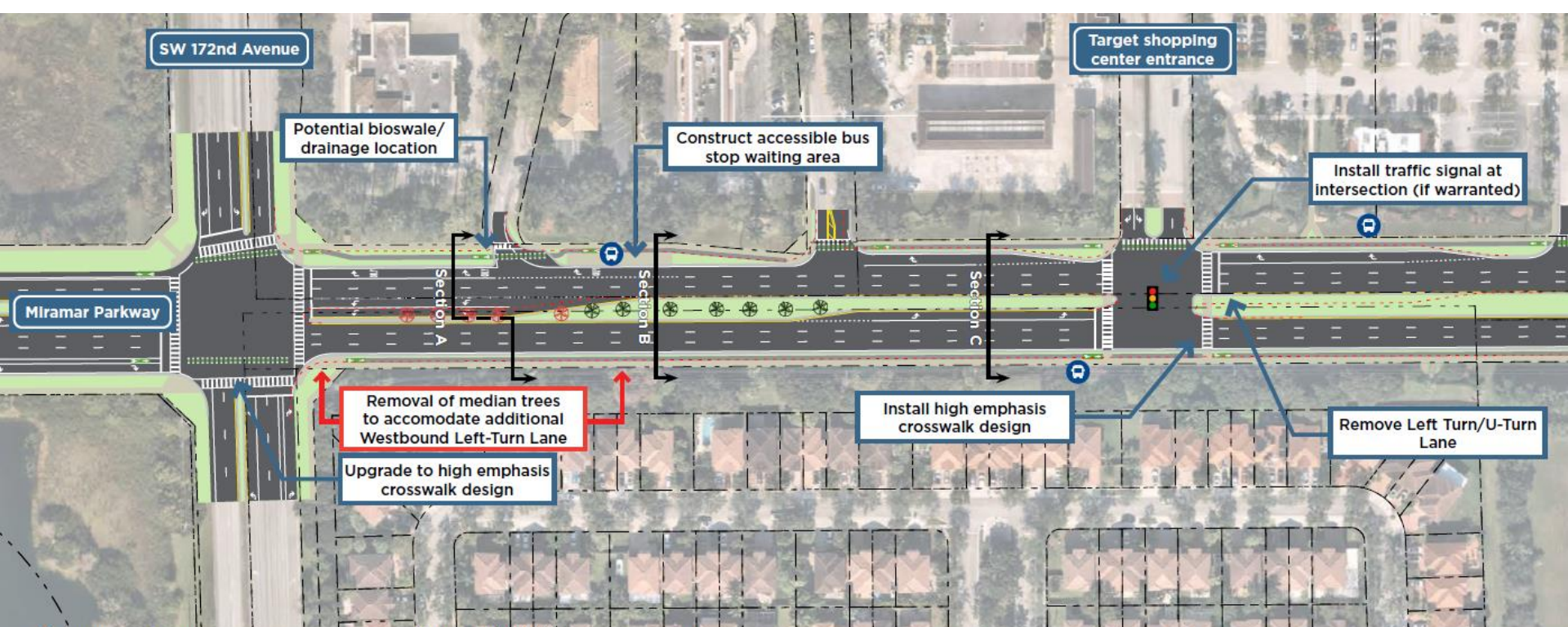

 - Three (3) new signalized intersections with crosswalks

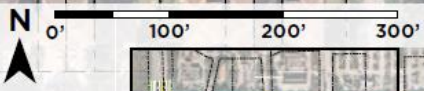

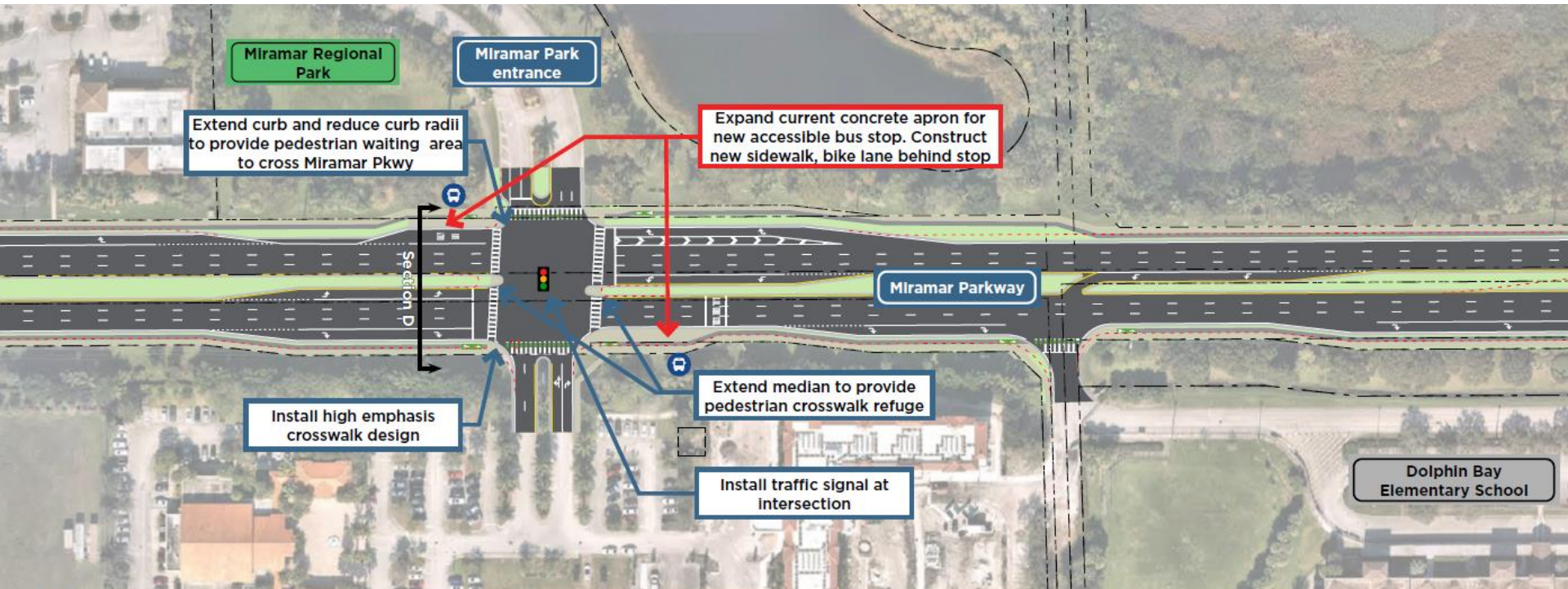


Location Map
