Broward Transportation Surtax Plan

Summary:

- ✓ The Plan incorporates and advances existing planning documents Broward MPO's Commitment 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), and County's Transit Development Plan (TDP), Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), etc.
- ✓ Traffic signal/intersection improvements also receive surtax revenues to facilitate funding through the MPO process.
- The Plan seeks connectivity across our 31 municipalities, job centers, and tourism destinations by establishing enhanced, efficient and accessible transit services, including: expand express bus, more frequent commuter bus service, increased service coverage, and add light rail.
- ☑ Complete Street elements, such as roadways, greenways, and pedestrian and bicycle improvements will be funded.

Operating Investments:

- 84% of all transit surtax revenues generated over the 30 years will be used for operations and maintenance, because of the amount of leverage available for capital projects.
- Over 30 years, \$1B in general fund contribution to the Transportation Department will continue. These funds will not be supplanted for other uses.
- \$5.5B in operating revenues of over 30 years, complimented by;
- \$5.3B in transit surtax revenues.
- State statute prohibits the use of infrastructure surtax revenue for operations and maintenance.

Capital Investments:

- \$1.35B infrastructure investment and \$204M in light rail vehicles to establish 21 miles of streetcar and light rail.
- \$639M over 30 years for Traffic, Roadway, Greenway, and Safety Capital Expenditures.
- \$441M for express bus infrastructure (w/o vehicles).
- \$367M investment in bus facilities and infrastructure (Park and Ride, Intermodal Facility and 3rd Maintenance Facility)
- \$501M over 30 years for enhanced and local bus service.
- \$1.2B of surtax revenue leverages \$4.4B of other capital revenues (local, state, federal grants/financial participation).
