A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S CYPRESS CREEK MOBILITY HUB STREETSCAPE PROJECT CONSTRUCT **IMPROVEMENTS** TO SIDEWALKS. ON-STREET PARKING, STREET LIGHTING, LANDSCAPING, BIKE LANES, CROSSWALKS, A SHARED USE PATH, REDUCED LANE WIDTHS, MEDIANS, A LANDSCAPED BUFFER BETWEEN THE SIDEWALK AND TRAVEL LANES. **STRIPING** CROSSWALK ENHANCED WEST CYPRESS CREEK ROAD, NORTH ANDREWS WAY, AND NW 59TH COURT WITHIN THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE AND COMMITTING TO MAINTAINING CITY-OWNED ROADWAYS AFTER THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S CYPRESS CREEK MOBILITY HUB STREETSCAPE PROJECT IS COMPLETED, PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida ("City"), endorsed the Cypress Creek Mobility Hub Master Plan on April 19, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Cypress Creek Mobility Hub Steering Committee has identified West Cypress Creek Road, North Andrews Way, and NW 59th Court for enhancements to encourage mixed-use development in the adjacent areas and to provide safe multimodal connections; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is proposing streetscape improvements that consist of constructing sidewalks, on-street parking, street lighting, landscaping, bike lanes, crosswalks, a shared use path, reduced lane widths, medians, a landscaped buffer between the sidewalk and travel lanes, and enhanced crosswalk striping within the proposed area; and

WHEREAS, the project will advance the City's Press Play Fort Lauderdale Strategic Plan 2018 initiative by improving transportation options, reducing congestion, and improving pedestrian bicycle, and vehicular safety; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is consistent with the City's goal of being pedestrian friendly and having a multimodal transportation system; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Lauderdale commits to maintaining the project on city-owned roadways after the Cypress Creek Mobility Hub Streetscape Project is completed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. The City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, hereby supports the Florida Department of Transportation's Cypress Creek Mobility Hub Streetscape Project improvements on West Cypress Creek Road, North Andrews Way, and NW 59th Court.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. The City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, hereby commits to maintaining the project on city-owned roadways after the Florida Department of Transportation's Cypress Creek Mobility Hub Streetscape Project is completed.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. If any clause, section or other part of this Resolution shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutional or invalid part shall be considered eliminated and will in no way affect the validity of other provisions of this Resolution.

<u>SECTION 4</u>. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

<u>SECTION 5</u>. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon final passage.

Resolution No. 2018-421 1 2 RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, 3 SUPPORTING THE BROWARD METROPOLITAN PLANNING 4 ORGANIZATION'S MOBILITY PROJECT TO CONSTRUCT BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN FACILITIES ALONG WEST 5 CYPRESS CREEK ROAD FROM POWERLINE ROAD TO THE SOUTH FLORIDA RAIL CORRIDOR; SUPPORTING FLORIDA 6 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AS THE AGENCY 7 THE PROJECT'S RESPONSIBLE FOR DESIGN. CONSTRUCTION, AND CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION; 8 AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 9 10 WHEREAS, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (the "MPO") has 11 funds under its Transportation Improvement Program (FM #435781-1) to construct bicycle and pedestrian facilities along West Cypress Creek Road from Powerline Road 13 to the South Florida Rail Corridor ("Project"); 14 WHEREAS, the Project is on a Broward County (the "County") road within the 15 City of Fort Lauderdale (the "City"); 16 WHEREAS, the MPO collaborated with the Florida Department of Transportation 17 ("FDOT"), the City, and the County to develop the Project to improve bicycle and 18 pedestrian safety; 19 WHEREAS, the County, as the owner of the Project's affected right-of-way, is 20 committed to continue funding the operation and maintenance of West Cypress Creek 21 Road: 22 WHEREAS, the Project will further the goal of the Board of County 23 Commissioners of Broward County, Florida (the "Board"), to "support the development,

1	design and construction of sustainable, multi-modal transportation facilities throughout
2	the County, to meet the demands of residents, travelers, businesses and the
3	community";
4	WHEREAS, the MPO requires a resolution from the County supporting the
5	Project;
6	WHEREAS, FDOT will be the agency responsible for design, construction, and
7	construction administration of the Project;
8	WHEREAS, FDOT requires a resolution from the County supporting its role as
9	the agency responsible for the Project's design, construction, and construction
10	administration; and
11	WHEREAS, FDOT will ensure that the design and construction of the Project
12	meet or exceed the "Minimum Standards Applicable to Public Rights-of-Way Under
13	Broward County Jurisdiction," Section 25.1, Exhibit 25.A, of the Broward County
14	Administrative Code, NOW, THEREFORE,
15	
16	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
17	BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

19	Section 1. The foregoing recitals are affirmed as true and correct and adopted
20	as part of this Resolution.
21	Section 2. The Board supports the Project to improve conditions for bicyclists
22	and pedestrians along West Cypress Creek Road to the South Florida Rail Corridor.
23	Section 3. The Board supports FDOT as the agency responsible for the
24	Project's design, construction, and construction administration.
