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# **VIRTUAL APPENDIX A: WALKING AUDIT NOTES & TEAM FINDINGS**

Team findings are bulleted, below. Positive findings are marked (+).

## Team 1A

- Narrow sidewalk
- Congested sidewalk from vegetation
- One main signalized intersection, others have stops signs
- Crosswalk to sidewalk access and signals needed at NW 20<sup>th</sup>/NW 49<sup>th</sup> Ave.
- Crosswalks should be added to help people cross north-south over NW 19<sup>th</sup> St.
- Cars speeding, no speed bumps (or traffic calming)
- Many apartment complexes have driveways off of NW 19<sup>th</sup> St.
- No speed limit signs
- Sidewalks far from the street, but they are too narrow
- Few street lamps, dark at night and some out of service
- Recommend considering a roundabout at NW 47<sup>th</sup> Ave. and NW 19<sup>th</sup> St.
- Crosswalks are not marked clearly
- People crossed mid-block, without crosswalks (there were no crosswalks)
- Some overgrown plants
- + Community garden
- Trash, litter along roadway
- One bench, nowhere for people to rest
- No amenities along walk or at bus stops
- No lighting at NW 47<sup>th</sup> Ave, a busy intersection
- Need reflectors on the road at intersections, especially
- Poor drainage along roadway, especially at NW 46<sup>th</sup> Ave. and NW 19<sup>th</sup> St.
- No lights at intersections
- Private property fences in bad shape
- Missing street sign at Hidden Forest Condominium
- Open pipe drains caution
- Overgrown grass and people park over and too close to the sidewalk
- Cracked and aged streets and sidewalks
- Need more shopping areas
- Need clear pedestrian crossings and lights
- There is a tube hanging out into the sidewalk
- Bus stops (service) and nature spots (placemaking) needed
- Sidewalks too close to traffic over the bridge
- The medians need replacing at some places
- No pedestrian crosswalk at Summit Park Apartments
- No crosswalk at NW 19<sup>th</sup> St. and NW 43<sup>rd</sup> Ave.
- No crosswalk at Hidden Forest Condominium
- No bike paths, no bikability
- Exposed iron bars that are dangerous
- Old and useless payphones



- Water pools in cement holes (recesses)
- Lakes should be cleaned
- + Saw ducks and turtles
- Potholes beside the (narrow) sidewalk
- Need more street lights
